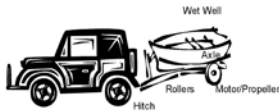

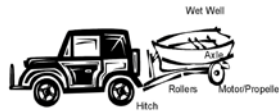
Follow the *NEW* HFCA Boat & Trailer Guidelines!

- ✓ When launching your boat, do not carry contaminants - fuel, lubricants, cleaning agents, or invasive species - onto the water.
- ✓ Make sure that all of your trash and recyclable items are carried off the water and properly disposed. Do not discard fishing line or tackle into the water as it is a hazard to all wildlife.
- ✓ Do not release bait, fish, plants or animals into the water, unless they were taken from that same body of water.
- ✓ When removing your boat from a lake or pond, check for debris such as mud, plants, fish, or animals on or in any part of your boat and trailer, and remove this debris.
- ✓ Drain all water from your boat before removing it from the boat launch area.
- ✓ Wash your boat and trailer and allow all parts of your boat to dry before launching on HFCA waters. DO NOT clean your boat at the boat launch. It is best to use a boat/car wash where water is recycled appropriately.

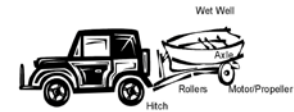
